**Details:** We invite your entries of scientific reports exhibiting CA native wildlife or their habitat. We especially encourage entries that feature endangered and threatened species in California, human impacts, or climatic changes and wildlife adaptations in your watershed.

Please see rules and guidelines for submissions below. You may enter on your own, or through a school or youth organization

**Entry is free!**

**Entries for science projects should focus on one of the following:**

**1) Species Profile** (recommended for K-5)

Information on a native species that includes: a) Habitat b) Diet c) Predators d) Human impacts e) A fun fact about the species

**2) Science Report** (recommended for 6-12)

A study describing how natural or human disturbances affect wildlife and their habitat. You may submit a presentation in the form of a PPT (up to 10 slides) or a poster that you photograph. Please submit: a) Clear title, b) Background on the study system (species, habitat, and disturbance) c) Evidence supporting claims d) Discussion of findings e) Conclusions

There will also be opportunities to present your research in a flipgrid presentation.
